## 9 Simple Keys to Success in Mr. D's Science Class

- 1. Study all vocabulary every day.
  - Go over the key terms for the whole chapter at least once
  - Use flash cards with the term on one side/picture and definition on the other side
    One inexpensive pack of index cards has 100, cut them in half and you have enough for 200 terms
  - Pictures help you associate an image with the word and you will understand the definition better
  - UNDERSTAND THE DEFINITION: Use your own words to explain a concept/term, but be accurate about it. **Don't use the glossary as a crutch.**
- 2. Read the section summary at the end of the chapter before you read the section (Start at the end.)
  - Get the main idea(s) of the section before you read it, the section will expand on the main idea(s).
- 3. Review the key terms for the section.
  - Go over the terms listed at the beginning of the section and **understand** them before you read.
- 4. Preview the section.
  - Look at pictures and read the captions
  - Read headings and subheadings to get a feel for the information in the section
  - Write down any questions that come to mind and try to answer them as you read
- 5. Be an active reader.
  - Use the objective(s) listed at the beginning of the section as questions and try to answer them as you read
  - Write down questions that come to mind (to be asked in class or researched on your own)
  - Write down any words or phrases that you don't understand (and get them explained/looked up)
- 6. Note Taking
  - Be sure to put your responses in your own words DON'T COPY FROM THE BOOK!
  - Follow the required format (stay organized using the headings).
  - DO MORE THAN THE MINIMUM: diagrams and labels, additional notes, etc.
- 7. Anticipate/Plan Ahead
  - Have "Section Reviews" (#1-6) done for a section before it will be covered in class.
  - Check the calendar for the tentative timeline for a chapter when it's available.
- 8. Participate in class.
  - Actively engage in class discussions and/or exercises.
  - Take notes (Write down what seems important, don't wait until later to write it down.)
  - We should add to our comp book any time something is NEW or a BETTER UNDERSTANDING
- 9. Use class time wisely.
  - Come to class prepared to learn
  - Stay on task and stay focused
  - Don't "just sit there"
  - "When I finish early, I must do something Appropriate, Quiet, Independent, and Productive."
